A. Call to Order

The Regular Meeting of the Wayne County Regional Educational Service Agency Board of Education was called to order by President Danielle Funderburg on August 19, 2026, at 8:32 a.m.

F. Approval of Agenda – *Introduction of New Staff was taken out of order until a quorum was present.*
Member Beri, with support from Member Blackmon, moved to approve the agenda as presented. The motion passed with a voice vote of 3-0.

G. President's Remarks and Board Comments

Member Blackmon welcomed representatives from SEMCOG and expressed appreciation for the organization's programs, expertise, and service to school districts and communities. She also thanked Dr. Colbert and staff for preparing a video tribute recognizing her years of service to the Wayne RESA Board of Education and shared her appreciation for the positive responses received from colleagues and community members.

President Funderburg acknowledged the recent passing of Jill Fennessy, a member of the Michigan Association of School Boards (MASB) Board of Directors, and expressed condolences to her family.

President Funderburg also shared the following highlights from Wayne County Schools.

- **Allen Park** – Congratulations to Allen Park High School students Annabel B. and Luca T., whose artwork was showcased at the Detroit Institute of Arts this summer alongside student artwork from across southeast Michigan.
- **Detroit** – Congratulations to recent Cass Tech graduate Emory J., who heads to Dartmouth College this fall as an Ivy League student-athlete.
- **Flat Rock** – Congratulations to Flat Rock Community Schools student Ty B. on being selected to the 2026 U.S. Under-18 Men's Select Team by USA Hockey!
- **Grosse Pointe** – Congratulations to six athletes from the Grosse Pointe South Blue Devils Swimming and Diving program who were named All-Americans by the National Interscholastic Swim Coaches Association (NISCA) for the 2025–2026 school year, earning recognition across three relay teams and two individual events.
- **Harper Woods** – Congratulations to Harper Woods middle school mathematics teacher Nyla Calloway on the release of her children's book, *I Can Do Anything*. The story empowers young readers to turn "I can't" into "I can," encouraging them to embrace challenges and persevere through relatable experiences.
- **Plymouth-Canton** – Congratulations to Samanyu M., an incoming freshman at Canton High School, and Neel N., a rising junior at Plymouth High School, on their outstanding performances at the International Geography Championships in Khao Lak, Thailand! Representing Plymouth-Canton Community Schools and the State of Michigan, both students competed against some of the world's top young geographers and earned fifth-place finishes in their respective categories.
- **South Redford** – Congratulations to Thurston High School junior Wynter S. on an incredible accomplishment at the HOSA – Future Health Professionals International Leadership Conference held in Indianapolis, Indiana, in June. After earning second place in Michigan in the Personal Care event, Wynter qualified to compete on the international stage, where she placed in the Top 10 among students from HOSA organizations worldwide.

Member Blackmon commented on the importance of teaching students about reducing food waste, conservation, and recycling. She expressed hope that more school districts would emphasize environmental stewardship through similar initiatives.

H. Communications – No communications were received.

I. Special Presentation(s)

1. **SEMCOG Resources to Support Demographic, Education, and Economic Development**
– Representatives from the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments (SEMCOG), Naheed Huq, Manager of Economic and Community Vitality; Grant Brooks, Economic and Community Vitality Planner; and Sirisha Uppalapati, Regional Development Forecast Supervisor, provided an overview of SEMCOG's regional planning role, member resources, demographic trends, and education and workforce policy priorities.

The presentation highlighted resources available to education members, including data and mapping, local assistance, policy and advocacy, education and engagement, and efforts to engage students in regional planning and transportation safety. Wayne County population and enrollment trends were reviewed, including declining birth rates, an aging population, domestic outmigration, shifts among school enrollment options, and projected declines in the school-age population. The presentation also addressed education and workforce policy

priorities, including stable and equitable education funding, alignment of education and training with workforce needs, expanded career pathways and experiential learning, and stronger partnerships among education, business, labor, and government. Board discussion included unfunded mandates, workforce readiness, career and technical education, and opportunities to better connect students with high-demand careers and regional employers.

J. Superintendent's Report

Deputy Superintendent of Educational Services, Beth Gonzalez

Ms. Gonzalez provided an update on preparations for the opening of the new Wayne RESA Early Childhood Center. She reported that required inspections have been completed and the Center is awaiting final licensing approval before welcoming students. Student enrollment and staff hiring and onboarding are underway, with professional learning planned for the instructional team. She also highlighted the September 2 Open House, which will provide Board members and families an opportunity to tour the Center, and noted the Center's broader goal of serving as an exemplar early childhood program while supporting the development of future early childhood educators.

Deputy Superintendent of Administrative Services, Kelly Bohl

Ms. Bohl provided updates on two action items before the Board. She introduced Kelley Williams, selected to serve as Executive Director for Early Childhood, highlighting her more than 30 years of educational experience and recent service as a leadership development consultant with Wayne RESA. Ms. Bohl also reviewed an intergovernmental agreement with the Wayne County Executive's Office providing up to \$10 million to support the development and implementation of the Future Aviation, Aerospace, and Aeronautics Professional Career and Technical Education Program, a regional initiative designed to strengthen the aviation and aerospace talent pipeline in Wayne County.

Senior Executive Director of Legislative Affairs, Mike Latvis

Mr. Latvis provided a brief legislative update, noting that the Legislature remains on summer recess following the August primary election. He reported that Wayne RESA is monitoring the possibility of a limited legislative session later in August and any education-related policy activity that may result. He also provided an update on the federal education tax credit/voucher program, noting that the state is awaiting additional IRS guidance and that Wayne RESA will continue monitoring developments and preparing information for constituent districts should Michigan elect to participate in the program.

Superintendent Dr. Daveda Colbert

Dr. Colbert shared:

- Upcoming dates and events were highlighted for the Wayne RESA Board of Education, including:
 - The Michigan Association of School Boards (MASB) Region 8 Legislative Priorities Meeting on Thursday, October 8, from 7:00–8:30 p.m. The meeting will be held virtually to encourage more Wayne County Association of School Board (WCASB) members to actively engage in MASB legislative priorities. Additional information, including the official flyer and the link from MASB, will be forwarded upon receipt.
 - The Shining Light Regional Cooperation Awards Ceremony and Luncheon will be held Wednesday, October 7, from 10:30 a.m.–1:00 p.m.
 - The Western Wayne Business Leaders Banquet will be held Tuesday, October 13, with networking beginning at 4:00 p.m. and dinner and the panel conversation beginning at 6:00 p.m.
 - The Wayne RESA Early Childhood Center Open House will be held on Wednesday, September 2, 2026, at 5:30 p.m. Board members were invited to attend.

- Board members were reminded to hold Wednesday, November 4, for the Board Audit Study Session at Wayne RESA.
- Continued work around aviation, aeronautics, and aerospace was highlighted, with Wayne RESA leadership scheduled to meet following the Board meeting at the Wayne County Executive's Office with Gary Torgow, Chairman of the Board of Directors for The Huntington National Bank, and Kylee Mitchell Wells, Executive Director for Southeast Michigan for Ballmer Group.
- Dr. Colbert, Beth Gonzalez, and Mike Latvis will present to the Junior Achievement of Southeastern Michigan Board of Directors during their Annual Board Meeting and Retreat on August 20, 2026. The presentation will focus on the state of education in Michigan and the educational landscape of Wayne County, demonstrating that "there's more to the story than being 44th in the nation." Highlights will include Wayne County's work on literacy, improved attendance outcomes, increased graduation rates, career awareness, exploration, and experiences. The presentation will conclude with the regional aviation, aeronautics, and aerospace work.
- The 2026–2027 Wayne RESA Goals document was provided to the Board, reflecting the goals discussed during the Board retreat. Appreciation was extended to Kate De Fuccio for her creativity in developing a document that is both visually appealing and informative.
- August was recognized as a time of new beginnings, renewed energy, and exciting possibilities. This was reflected in the introduction of new staff and the recommendation of Kelley Williams for the role of Executive Director of Early Childhood. The work continues as school leaders, educators, support staff, families, and communities look forward to Wayne RESA's continued partnership.
- Wayne RESA's commitment to partnership and leadership was reinforced, with a continued focus on being a partner and a leader, reflecting on what happened previously, and looking toward what lies ahead. Wayne County's depth and diversity continue to define its public schools, and as the largest ISD in Michigan, Wayne RESA remains committed to student success by navigating change, pursuing innovation, and remaining focused on what matters most: improving student outcomes. When one district succeeds, Wayne County succeeds. Each community is unique, but all are moving toward the same goal.
- Continued community support for public education was recognized following the August 4 primary, where ballot proposals for Detroit Public Schools Community District, Northville Public Schools, Wayne-Westland Community Schools, and Hamtramck Public Schools were approved. The results speak volumes about Wayne County and its communities, reinforcing that strong communities require strong schools, and strong schools require strong communities.
- The importance of continued advocacy for public education was emphasized. Wayne RESA will continue to advocate at the highest levels and make the case for excellent public schools and an excellent public education because it matters for every child, every family, and every community.
- A warm welcome back was extended to all Wayne County school communities, reaffirming that Wayne RESA will remain a steadfast partner and continue to share leadership across the county.
 - Dr. Colbert shared that she had the opportunity to serve as the keynote speaker for Westwood Community Schools. She had the privilege of helping welcome the district back for the new school year as part of its "Game Changers" theme at the Ted Scott Campus of Wayne County Community College District. The opportunity reflected the excitement surrounding the start of another school year and the work ahead.
- The report concluded with excitement for another impactful school year where students feel seen, valued, challenged, supported, and inspired. Wayne RESA will continue to work collectively, collaboratively, and intentionally around "*Leading Learning for All*."
