A. Call to Order

The Regular Meeting of the Wayne County Regional Educational Service Agency Board of Education was called to order by Vice President Danielle Funderburg on December 17, 2025, at 8:32 a.m.

G. President’s Remarks and Board Comments

Member Petrie welcomed Member Beri back to the board table and commented on the Governor’s recent emphasis on literacy, noting that Wayne RESA has long prioritized this work. He stated that the Board welcomes collaboration and is open to considering new ideas that support ongoing literacy efforts.

Member Beri shared appreciation for the Governor’s recent presence and engagement in the Downriver community. He also thanked colleagues for their well wishes during his recovery.

Vice President Funderburg shared the following highlights from Wayne County Schools –

- **Detroit** – Congratulations to DPSCD 5th grader, Lyric W. of Schulze Academy of Technology and Arts for winning The Skillman Foundation 2025 Float Design Contest with The Parade Company. Lyric’s artistic vision came to life on Thanksgiving Day as her winning float design rolled down Woodward Avenue in America’s Thanksgiving Parade.

- **Flat Rock** – Congratulations to high school freshman Hunter S. for earning All-State recognition as a member of the Esports team. He is one of only four Michigan students to earn the honor.
- **Plymouth-Canton** -Congratulations to the Plymouth-Canton Community Schools Automotive Program for receiving a generous \$45,000 grant from the Margaret Dunning Foundation. The funding will provide new, state-of-the-art equipment for the auto technician and auto body programs at Canton High School, expanding hands-on learning and helping prepare students for high-demand careers in automotive and manufacturing.
- **Trenton** – Congratulations to Trenton School District, which received a generous donation of \$20,000 from the Trenton VFW to support Arthur's Middle School's annual Washington, D.C. trip. This incredible gift will fund two student scholarships each year, helping ensure that more AMS students can experience this unforgettable learning opportunity, regardless of their financial situation.
- **Wayne-Westland** – Congratulations to the Wayne-Westland Community Schools Community who welcomed Golling Chevrolet of Wayne as the Title Sponsor of its elementary athletic program. Golling Chevrolet has invested \$100,000 to help expand and sustain athletic opportunities for elementary students across Wayne-Westland. The game-changing contribution will help grow participation across the elementary athletic program, provide more opportunities for students across grades K-5, keep programs free for families, and build stronger, healthier, more connected schools.

H. Communications – No communications were submitted to the Board.

I. Special Presentations

1. Performance by Wayne Memorial Symphony Band and Orchestra

Under the direction of Band Director David Mety, students representing the Wayne Memorial Symphony Band and Orchestra performed selections during the Wayne RESA Board of Education meeting. Wayne-Westland Community School District Superintendent, Dr. Catherine Cost, thanked Wayne RESA for the invitation and for providing Wayne Memorial High School students with the opportunity to share their talents.

2. MiFamily: Countywide Cradle-to-Career Impact – In Schools and With Community

Executive Director of Educational Services, Mari Treece, and Literacy Consultant, Mellissa Wilson, presented an overview of the MiFamily Region 10 initiative, a state-funded program administered by Wayne RESA and serving Wayne, Oakland, and Macomb counties. The presentation highlighted MiFamily's cradle-to-career approach to strengthening authentic partnerships among schools, families, and community organizations, with a focus on literacy, student readiness, attendance, and social-emotional development. Board members were informed of key program components, including family literacy kits for newcomer families, library-based literacy programming, summer learning supports, the MiFamily Network, and the distribution of mini-grants ranging from \$2,000 to \$15,000 to schools and community organizations. The presenters emphasized the initiative's alignment with Michigan's Essential Practice #10 and the Wayne County Literacy Promise, noting that MiFamily is in its third year of a four-year grant funded by MiLEAP.

J. Superintendent's Report

Senior Executive Director of Legislative Affairs, Mike Latvis

- At the federal level –
 - Congress is operating under a continuing resolution through January 30, 2026, with risk of another federal shutdown.
 - Discussions continue regarding a proposed bill by Congressman John James to redirect unobligated U.S. Department of Education funds to the IDEA; however, available unobligated funds are limited (estimated at \$10–11 million annually), and the bill has not yet been introduced. National education groups, including AASA, have indicated they do not support the proposal due to its limited fiscal impact and concern that it may not address long-term IDEA underfunding.
- At the state level –
 - A budget action by the Michigan House resulted in the reallocation of approximately \$645 million in previously approved work project funds, affecting a range of public, nonprofit, and infrastructure initiatives statewide. While K–12 education and the School Aid Fund were largely unaffected, some education-related programs experienced impacts, prompting legal and procedural challenges.
 - The Governor's recent Literacy Summit highlighted an emphasis on strengthening and funding existing literacy initiatives rather than introducing new requirements. Anticipated budget priorities include the foundation allowance, limited weighting adjustments, continued literacy supports, and the continuation of early childhood programs such as PreK for All.

Deputy Superintendent of Educational Services, Beth Gonzalez

- Ms. Gonzalez provided highlights from the Governor's Literacy Summit, noting a panelist referenced Wayne RESA's partnership work and the impact of Wayne RESA's UFLI implementation in supporting science-of-reading aligned instruction. Discussion included Mississippi's long-term, statewide literacy approach (policy, funding, and coordinated systems), including elements such as A–F grading and third-grade retention.
- Ms. Gonzalez also reported that Wayne RESA convened an informational session for newly identified three-year partnership districts (19 districts identified, varying by grade configuration) and outlined supports for the next cycle, including launch of an optional Instructional Impact Collaborative focused on strengthening the instructional core and increasing grade-level, engaging instruction. Each partnership district will receive a dedicated Educational Improvement Consultant leading an intensive support team (primary supports include special education, literacy, math, educational improvement, and culture/climate, with additional supports available as needed).
- Finally, Ms. Gonzalez shared an update on renewed coordination with Wayne County Community College and the Wayne County Jail to reestablish GED programming for incarcerated young adults, prioritizing individuals with IEPs, and noted plans to begin classes in January 2026.

Deputy Superintendent of Administrative Services, Kelly Bohl

- Ms. Bohl reported that a stormwater resolution will be presented for Board approval as part of Wayne RESA's permitting requirements with the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy (EGLE). EGLE now requires large institutions, including schools, to demonstrate controls preventing non-stormwater discharges. Wayne RESA worked with Arch Environmental to review and enhance its existing stormwater management plan, and the drafted resolution meets state compliance requirements for the January permitting process.
- Ms. Bohl also provided a legal update regarding ongoing litigation challenging the privilege waiver

provision in Section 31aa of the School Aid Act. Oral arguments on cross-motions for summary disposition were heard December 11 in the Michigan Court of Claims, with the judge indicating a decision will be issued by December 19. Federal court oral arguments are scheduled for December 18, with counsel seeking a ruling that the provision also violates the U.S. Constitution.

Assistant Superintendent of Financial Services, Drew McMechan

- Mr. McMechan reported on two resolutions related to one-time Act 18 fund distributions supporting special education costs and special education transportation being presented to the Board. The proposed distributions represent approximately a 10% increase over last year, totaling just over \$5 million in additional disbursements, driven by increased district-level special education expenditures.
 - Consistent with prior Board direction, the distributions will continue at the same level as the previous year, with adjustments reflecting current cost increases. Administration will continue to monitor fund balance impacts and will bring forward recommendations during the budget process regarding potential reductions in distributions beginning in the 2026–27 school year.

Superintendent Dr. Daveda Colbert

Dr. Colbert shared:

- We were excited and grateful to welcome the Wayne Memorial Symphony Band and Orchestra, their Band Director, Mr. David Mety, Wayne-Westland Community School District Interim Superintendent Dr. Catherine Cost, and 45 outstanding instrumental music scholars whose performance was truly stellar. Thank you to the Wayne RESA staff who took the time to support and celebrate the student performers, because, as always, our scholars are the reason we are here.
- Thank you to the Mi-Family team, Wayne RESA Literacy Consultant Mellissa Wilson, and Wayne RESA Educational Services Executive Director Mari Treece for their continued efforts to strengthen meaningful connections with students and families. This important work reflects our shared commitment to improving outcomes by leaning into our mission and vision of Leading Learning for All.
- Deep gratitude was expressed for the opportunity to serve the more than 260,000 students across Wayne County. While there is much to celebrate, Wayne RESA remains steadfast in its commitment to continuous improvement and to strengthening outcomes for all learners. From early childhood to career and technical education, teams across the organization are working with purpose, urgency, and intentionality to ensure every scholar has access to high-quality learning experiences.
- A key focus of our work continues to be educating families about the early learning opportunities available to them, while increasing enrollment in Great Start Readiness Programs for four-year-olds throughout the county. Research consistently demonstrates that participation in high-quality, evidence-based preschool programs supports early literacy and mathematics development, strengthens social-emotional skills, and promotes cognitive growth, leading to improved long-term outcomes. Wayne RESA remains committed to strategic outreach, particularly to hard-to-reach families, recognizing that early childhood education is a critical investment in our youngest learners and in the future of our communities.
- As part of Michigan's recent Literacy Summit, the statewide call to action to improve literacy outcomes was clear. Wayne RESA and Wayne County constituent districts were engaged in this work well before the summit, having hosted its own Literacy Summit three years ago. That sustained focus has yielded measurable progress, while acknowledging that important work remains. The Wayne

County Literacy Promise continues to guide this effort, emphasizing high expectations; a guaranteed and viable curriculum; implementation science; adequate instructional time; data-driven decision-making; transparency and integrity; inclusive and culturally responsive practices; disciplinary literacy; and strong partnerships with families. Wayne RESA remains aligned with research and best practices and is committed to a cohesive, long-term literacy vision through strategic collaboration with state and local partners.

- Wayne RESA teams were recognized and celebrated for representing the organization with excellence through internal professional learning, district-based support, and statewide and national presentations. Kudos to the RESA team for consistently showcasing the strength and impact of our work.
- As we approach the end of the year, the Wayne RESA family was encouraged to prioritize rest and reflection. Looking ahead to January, Wayne RESA Senior Executive Director of Information Technology Solutions, Kurt Rheume will present a deeper analysis of county enrollment data. Enrollment history includes 260,890 students in 2022–23, 260,556 in 2023–24, and 262,242 in 2024–25, with preliminary enrollment this year at 261,294 students.
- Thank you to the Wayne RESA Board of Education and the entire Wayne RESA family for your continued support. Wishing all Wayne County stakeholders a restful break and a peaceful holiday season.

N. General Board Comments

Member Funderburg expressed appreciation for staff leadership and RESA's longstanding literacy efforts, noting that Wayne RESA's focus on literacy began prior to the current statewide initiatives. She emphasized the importance of early educational support to prevent future barriers for students, referencing the connection between educational access and long-term outcomes. She commended the organization for its continued commitment to *Leading Learning for All*.

Member Petrie extended holiday wishes and echoed appreciation for the organization's continued leadership. He expressed pride in Wayne RESA's ongoing focus and the collective efforts of its leaders and staff.

President Blackmon reported on the recent National Alliance of Black School Educators (NABSE) conference, noting that Wayne RESA staff delivered well-attended and highly informative presentations. She expressed pride in the organization's strong representation, the quality of the sessions and workshops, and the engagement of both longtime members and first-time attendees. President Blackmon also shared that the conference featured notable speakers, including Colin Kaepernick, whose session was highly attended and well-received, and who expressed interest in future engagement with students in Detroit and Wayne County. She concluded by extending holiday wishes to the RESA staff.

Member Petrie, with support from Member Funderburg, moved to adjourn the meeting. The motion passed with a voice vote of 4-0. President Blackmon adjourned the meeting at 11:16 a.m.
