NON-TRADITIONAL STUDENTS

Revised October 1, 2018

Each non-traditional pupil must be identified on the building alpha rosters (or separate lists by building, by grade level), using the following one-digit alpha code. All nonresidents must be identified with the district of residence code and a non-traditional code.

ALTERNATIVE EDUCATION

Pupil who is counted in a grade level but is participating in an alternative program

CHOICE - CONTIGUOUS ISD

Х

Nonresident pupil residing in a district in a contiguous ISD and attending a district established as "choice" under Section 105c of the State Aid Act.

CHOICE - WITHIN WAYNE RESA

0

Non-resident pupil attending a district established as "choice" under Section 105 of the State Aid Act.

COOPERATIVE EDUCATION

C

A voluntary agreement between & among districts to provide certain educational programs for pupils (includes vocational and alternative education programs). Note: If a pupil attends high school B in the AM and then goes to a special education center program in the PM, the pupil would be coded with a "C" in high school B and "K" in the center program.

COOPERATIVE PROGRAM IN WHICH FTE IS CLAIMED BY DISTRICT OF RESIDENCE

V

Pupil attending a cooperative program (e.g., vocational or alternative education) outside his/her district of residence with the FTE being claimed by the district of residence.

Important Note: The FTEs for these pupils will not be summarized in the non-traditional code report. However, a "&" will appear next to the pupil's name on the grade roster.

COURT PLACED

J

A pupil who meets criteria in Section 24 of the State Aid Act. Applies only to Clara B. Ford, ACE, and Capstone public school academies.

DUAL ENROLLMENT

D

Pupil enrolled in postsecondary academic courses who meets criteria in Public Act 160 of 1996.

DROPOUT RECOVERY PROGRAM (23a)

23

Pupil enrolled in a 12-month dropout recovery program. Pupil is eligible for $1/12^{\rm th}$ of an FTE for each month that they are enrolled in the program and in full attendance.

EARLY MIDDLE COLLEGE PROGRAM (High School Program)

(NEW)

CP

Early Middle College Program that is a **high school program** designed to allow a pupil to earn a high school diploma and either associate's degree, professional certification, Early Middle College Assoc. technical certification, 60 transferable college credits or the right to participate in a registered apprenticeship.

FOREIGN EXCHANGE STUDENT

6

Pupil who is participating in a foreign exchange program.

HOMEBOUND/HOSPITALIZED

Н

Pupil who has a documented medical condition that requires him/her to be hospitalized or confined to home during regular school hours.

HOME-BASED EDUCATION

L

Includes two types of pupils who are receiving the minimum of two one-hour periods of instruction per week at home or a neutral site: (1) expulsions under Section 1311 of the Revised School Code for weapons, arson, or sexual misconduct (1.0 FTE) and (2) expulsions for other reasons (FTE based on actual teacher/student contact time)

HOME-SCHOOLED 4

A pupil educated at home who is taking non-core classes at a public school district.

MOVES OUT BETWEEN COUNT DAYS

N

A pupil who (1) moves out of your district after the Fall count but before the Supplemental count and (2) chooses to complete the school year in your district. Notes: You DO NOT need permission from the pupil's new district of residence to claim this student for state aid, but you must indicate the pupil's new district of residence. The language in this section is permissive. Consequently, you may or may not allow such a pupil to complete the school year in your district (his/her former district of residence).

OFFLINE SEAT-TIME WAIVER

9

Pupil that is looking for an alternative learning option while working toward their high school diploma or grade progression in a department-approved alternative or innovative education program.

Do not use for pupils taking only one or two online classes/semester.

PARENT-INITIATED ENROLLMENT WITH RELEASE FROM DISTRICT OF RESIDENCE

F

PARENT-INITIATED ENROLLMENT WITHOUT RELEASE FROM DISTRICT OF RESIDENCE

G

NOTE: Do not include pupils exempt under Section 6(6) of the State Aid Act. See Code 3.

PART-TIME

P

Pupils whose entire educational schedule is less than 1,098 hours.

PUPIL COUNT EXCEPTION

CE

A pupil less than 22 years of age as of September 1 of the school year, has dropped out of school, and is enrolled in a public school academy or an alternative education high school diploma program that is primarily focused on educating pupils with extreme barriers.

REDUCED SCHEDULE

R

Individual pupil taking a minimum of 879 hours per year; in best educational interest of pupil; must have supporting documentation.

SECTION 6(6) of the State Aid Act

3

A nonresident pupil that may be counted for membership without obtaining permission from the district of residence. See Section 4 of the MDE's <u>Pupil</u> Accounting Manual for details. Note: Pupil's district of residence must be indicated. Do not include students who qualify in codes N, O, and X.

SHARED-TIME (NONPUBLIC)

S

Pupil from a nonpublic school (K-12) who attends non-core classes in the public school district or a pupil in a nonpublic school who is taught non-core classes by a public school teacher.

SPECIAL EDUCATION CENTER PROGRAM

K

Pupil attending a special education center program as designated in the RESA County Plan.

VIRTUAL LEARNING

VL

Method of receiving instruction through a digital learning environment for K-12 pupils where courses are from the local district, board-approved or statewide virtual course catalog(MVU).

WORK-BASED LEARNING EXPERIENCE

W

Approved programs as detailed in Chapter 5P of the Michigan Department of Education's Pupil Accounting Manual
