



What is Catamaran?

Catamaran is the system used by the state to promote positive outcomes and ensure compliance with the *Individuals with Disabilities Education Act* (IDEA) of 2004 and the *Michigan Administrative Rules for Special Education*. Catamaran was designed to help locals analyze and interpret data and keep track of all monitoring activities in a single location. Catamaran reflects the priorities of the IDEA 2004 and the State Performance Plan (SPP) and is aligned with the School Improvement Framework. Catamaran is managed by MDE OSE (Office of Special Education)

Reviewing District Work in Catamaran

 Work must be completed at the district level first and submitted to the ISD so that the ISD is able to complete their work



ISD Responsibility




ISD Responsibilities: Verification of Correction

- Data CAPs (B-11, B-12, B-13): Verification activity varies by indicator
- Complaint CAPs: Verifies documentation of the activities, conducts a review of student files to ensure a change of practice has occurred and compliance has been achieved, documents correction of noncompliance
- Monitoring CAPs: Verifies documentation of the activities, conducts a review of student files to ensure a change of practice has occurred and compliance has been achieved, documents correction of noncompliance
- Student Level Corrective Action Plan (SLCAP): Potentially issued during a focused monitoring activity, the B-13 data collection, or a state complaint if correctable student level noncompliance is identified
