- 2) Joanna Lofton, Community Resource Specialist, **Autism Alliance of Michigan Navigator** connects families with a team of specialists such as OT, SP, Nurse Practitioner, etc.

- *Employment* work with employers to support hiring individuals with Autism, also work with all disabilities.

Response to Oxford Crisis

- 1. Since the tragic event at Oxford High School on November 30, 2021, and throughout the week, Dr. Colbert remained in close contact with Wayne County superintendents and WRESA staff to provide support, resources, and check-ins. Departments have reached out to colleagues in Oakland County to provide any support needed. Dr. Colbert was in contact with the Wayne County Sheriff's office, Michigan State Police and the Governor's office to ensure a safe learning environment within our schools. "Wayne RESA Comprehensive School Threat Assessment Resource Guide" developed by the Safe and Healthy Schools team was also shared with superintendents.
